Richard Dawkins, biologist and best-selling author, claims that belief in God is a "delusion" and that "religion" harms society. Dawkins contends that he has reason and evidence on his side, and he dismisses faith as unfounded, even irrational. Dominican Thomas Crean tackles Dawkins' claims head-on. He presents straightforward arguments for God's existence, and he uses reason and evidence to defend such things as miracles and the authority of the Bible. He also shows how God is important for a coherent understanding of morality, and why Dawkins' approach winds up reducing morality to the individual's subjective likes and dislikes. By demonstrating how Dawkins' criticisms rest on misunderstandings, superficial readings, poor argumentation, a lack of historical awareness, and not a little prejudice, Crean reveals Dawkins to be out of his philosophical and theological depth, and his case against God to be fundamentally flawed. Philosophers have traditionally used two strategies to refute the sceptical that empirical knowledge is not possible because our beliefs cannot be adequately justified. One strategy rejects the sceptics' position because it conflicts with the supposedly. But as Edward Feser shows in *The Last Superstition*, there is not, and never has been, any war between science and religion at all. There has instead been a conflict between

two entirely philosophical worldviews: the classical "teleological vision" of Plato, Aristotle, Augustine, and Aquinas, on which purpose or goal-directedness is as inherent a feature of the material world as mass or electric charge; and the modern "mechanical" vision of Descartes, Hobbes, Locke, and Hume, according to which physical reality is comprised of nothing more than purposeless, meaningless particles in motion. The point at issue accordingly resolves itself into the relation of Thornton's essay to Longe's pamphlet.

Nominally at least there is no dependence. Neither in Thornton's formal treatise nor in Mill's ponderous recantation is Longe's name or work so much as mentioned. As to any actual indebtedness, there is marked difference of opinion on the part of commentators. A trenchant critic in the Quarterly Review of July, 1871, declared flatly that Mr. Thornton, in the first edition of his above-cited work On Labor, ' adopted without acknowledgment Mr. Longe's previously published refutation of that theory. Some years later, Francis A.
